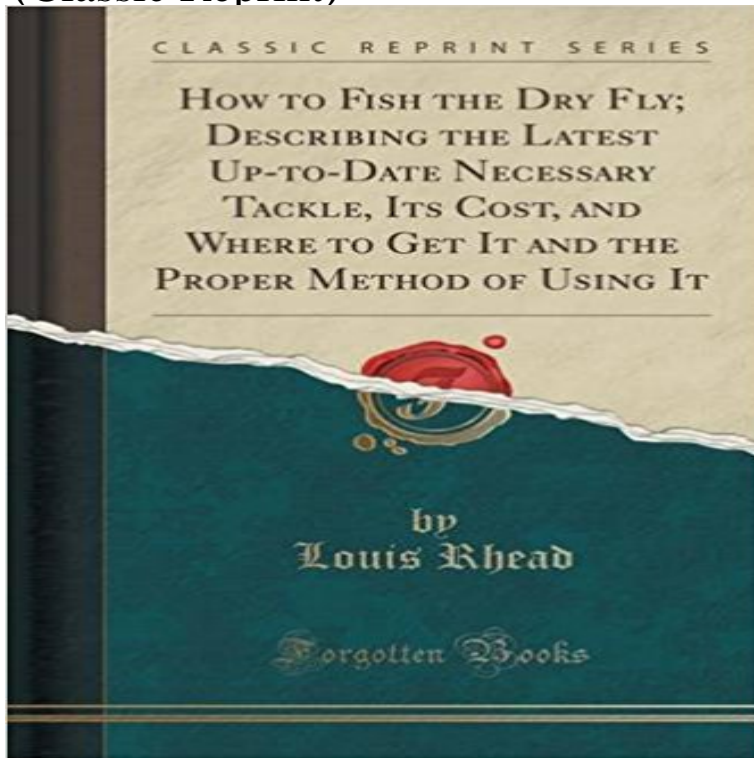

Gill and George M. L. La Branche, who have described their views with great detail and compared the difference in the method pursued in England, as well as by themselves on our own streams.
