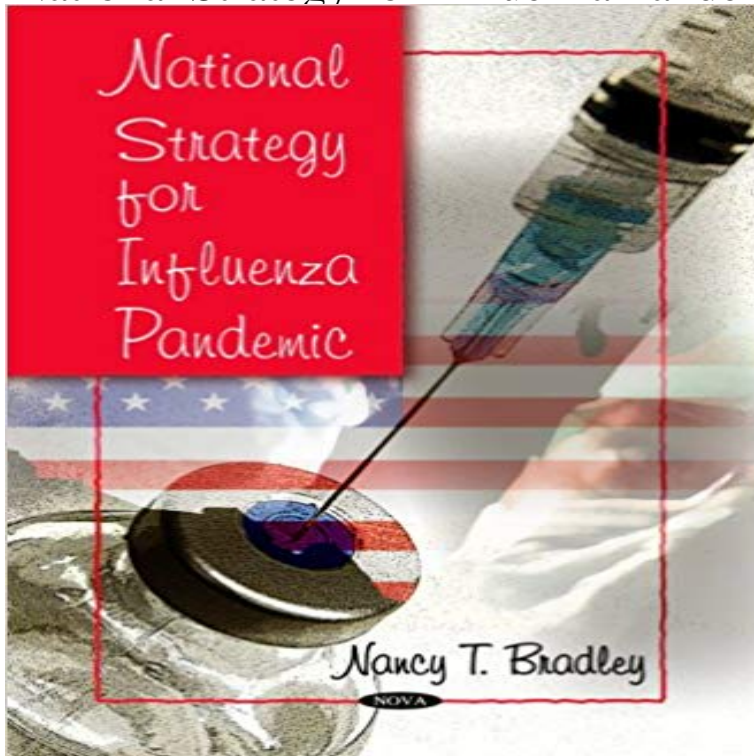


National Strategy for Influenza Pandemic



In the last century, three influenza pandemics swept the globe. In 1918 the first pandemic (sometimes referred to as the Spanish Flu) killed over 500,000 Americans and more than 20 million people worldwide. One-third of the U.S. population was infected and average life expectancy was reduced by 13 years. Pandemics in 1957 and 1968 killed tens of thousands of Americans and millions across the world. Scientists believe that viruses from birds played a role in each of these outbreaks. Today we face a new threat. A new influenza strain - influenza A (H5N1) - is spreading through bird populations across Asia, Africa, and Europe, infecting domesticated birds including ducks and chickens and long-range migratory birds. This implementation plan for the National Strategy for Pandemic Influenza further clarifies the roles and responsibilities of governmental and non-governmental entities.
