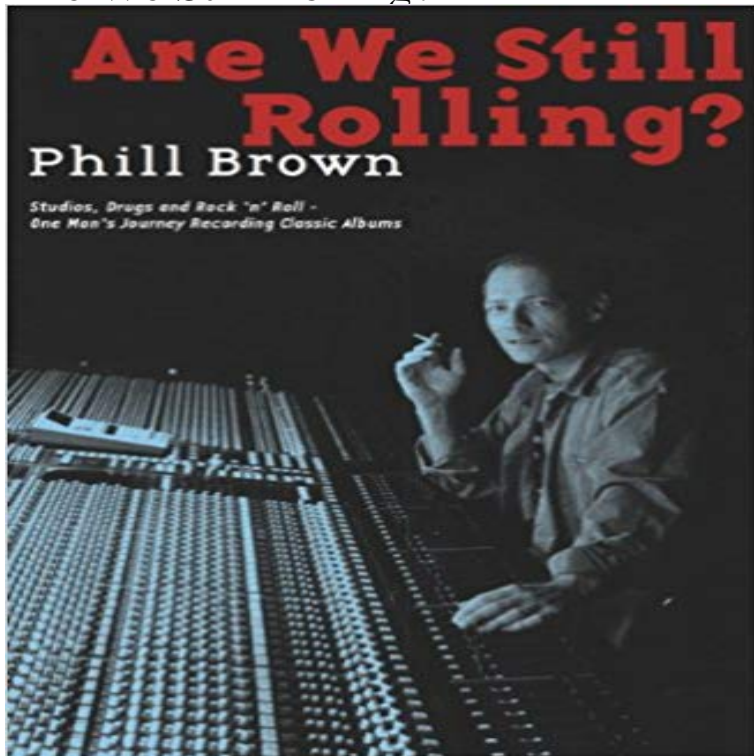


Are We Still Rolling?
